

INSTRUMENT.

This Survey was made with a Gurleys Surveyors Transit with solar attachment and the courses determined by deflection from a meridian established by observation on Polaris.

The distances were measured by a 200 ft. and 50 ft. steel tapes.

Note 1. The differences between the courses of the boundary lines of this claim as here returned and as given in the location notice is due to error in the latter.

On the ground all corners were established as here returned.

ERROR.

The course and length of the $1/4$ Sec. line between the N.E. $1/4$ Sec. 24 Tp. 28 S. Rg. 60 E. and Sec. 19 Tp. 28 S. Rg. 61 E. I find to be N. $1^{\circ}28'$ E. 2741.1 ft. instead of North 2640 ft. as given in official notes of survey of this line.

REPORT

The $1/4$ Sec. Cor. between Sec. 19 Tp. 28 S. Rg. 61 E and Sec. 24 Tp. 28 S. Rg. 60 E. Mt. Diablo B. and M. is a cedar post 3 ins. diam. 2 ft. above ground in mound of earth and stone blazed and scribed $1/4$ S. on the west Side. I observed no marked stone.

The N. W. Cor. Sec. 19 Tp. 28 S. Rg. 61 E and the N. E. Cor Sec. 24 Tp. 28 S. Rg. 60 E. is a rhyolite stone of irregular shape 10 X 12 X 20 ins. high set in a mound of rock and marked with 3 notches on the north and 3 notches on the south sides.
