

SURVEY NO. 2632

I N S T R U M E N T

This survey was made with the Keuffel and Esser Light Mountain Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian, as determined by an observation on Polaris at Eastern Elongation. The distances were measured with 500 ft. and 100 ft. Steel Tapes.

S U R F A C E.

The surface embraced by this survey is low rolling hills, void of timber and other natural objects for bearings.

Note:- The difference between these field notes and the location certificate is due to errors in the latter.

REPORT:- The Corner to Sections 25, 26, 35 and 36, Tp. 28-S., R. 61-E., M.D.M. mentioned above in these Field Notes, is a granite boulder 12 x 8 inches, 20 inches above the ground, with mound of rock, chiseled 1 notch on the South and 1 on the East.

After diligent search the 1/4 Sec. Corner between Secs. 25 and 26, and the 1/4 Sec. Corner between Secs. 25 and 36, Tp. 28-S., R. 61-E., M.D.M. could not be found.
