The disagreement between these field notes and the Amended Location Certificates in regard to the courses and distances of the boundary lines and the position of the discovery workings are due to errors in the latter.

Report.

✓ The S. 1/4 Cor. Sec. 28, T. 3 N., R. 42 E., M.D.M. is a rhyolite stone 4 x 6 ins. showing 10 ins. above the ground, chiseled 1/4 on South face.

✓ The S. W. Cor. Sec. 28, T. 3 N., R. 42 E. M.D.M. is a tufa stone 5 x 2 1/2 ins. showing 10 ins. above the ground, chiseled llll on East face and l on South face it is surrounded by a mound of stones.

✓ Cor. No. 4 Sur. No. 2400, General Miles lode, is a pine post 4 ins. square, showing 2 ft. above a mound of earth and stone, scribed 4-2400.

✓ Cor. Nos. 4-1 Sur. No. 2400, Admiral Dewey lode, are pine posts 4 ins. square, showing 2 ft. above a mound of earth and stone. scribed 4-2400 and 1-2400 respectively.

✓ The intersections with the section lines were calculated from the returns of the Public Land Surveys.

✓ I made diligent search for the S. 1/4 Cor. Sec. 29, T. 3 N., R. 42 E. M.D.M. and was unable to find any trace of the same.
