DESCRIPTION OF CORNERS.

The Cor. to sections 14, 15, 22 and 23, T. 23 N. R. 62 E. of the Mt. Dia. B. and M., is a quartzite rock 8 x 9 ins., 12 ins. above ground, in monument of stone, with 2 notches on the East face, and 3 notches on the South face.

Sur. No. 2699 A, John Bull Mine Lode:

Cor. No. 1 is a pine post, 4 ins. square, with mound of stone, standing 2 ft. above the ground, scribed 1-2699-A.

Sur. No. 2700-B, Grand View Mill Site:

Cor. No. 3, is a pine post, 4 ins. square, standing 2 ft. above the ground with mound of earth, scribed 3-2700-B.

Cor. No. 4 is a pine post, 4 ins. square, standing 2 ft. above the ground, with mound of stone, scribed 4-2700 B.
