✓ No. 11 An open cut, the mouth of which bears S. 71° W. 278.5 ft. from Cor. No. 2. of Copper Queen Side 10 ft. wide, 2 ft. deep, running N. 17° E. 117 ft. in earth and rock
 Value \$400.00

✓ No. 12 An open cut, the mouth of which bears from Cor. No. 2 of Copper Queen Side S. 71° W. 278.5 ft. 9 ft. wide, average depth 8 ft. running N. 56° 31' W. 52. ft. in earth and rock, and a mine at face of same. 6 x 8 ft. 8 ft. deep in rock, and a tunnel from face of cut 5 x 7 ft. running N. 56° 31' W. 51.5 ft. and at a point 29 ft. from mouth of tunnel, a drift 5 x 7 ft. 40 ft. long, running N. 23° 30' E. 40 ft. and from same point an upraise to surface 3 x 20 ft. 30 ft. long, course S. 40° E. Tunnel, drift and upraise in rock
 Value \$2074.00

Instrument

This survey was made with a Gullery Light Mountain Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with 100 ft. and 400 ft. steel tapes.

Report.

Description of Corners.

The corner to Secs. 29, 30, 31 and 32, T. 8 N. R. 38 E. of the Mount Diablo base and meridian is a basalt stone 12 x 12 x 8 ins. above ground, marked with 1 notch on S. and 5 notches on E. edges and mound of earth
