INSTRUMENT.

This survey was executed with a Buff and Buff mining transit No. 4, with verniers of horizontal and vertical circles reading to single minutes of arc.

The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observation.

The distances were measured with a 500 ft. steel tape.

REPORT.

The N.W.Cor. of Sec. 8, T. 20 N., R. 24 E., M.D.B. and M. is a basalt stone 8 x 6 x 10 ins. above ground, set in a mound of stone and marked with 5 notches on S. and 5 notches on E. edge.

The discrepancies existing between the field notes of this survey and the location certificate is due to errors in the latter.

Known as the *Precious Hill Mill Ditch*,
represented in the foregoing field notes as having been surveyed by said deputy mineral surveyor and under his direction; and that said survey has been in all respects, to the best of our knowledge and belief, faithfully and correctly executed, and the corner and boundary monuments established according to law and the instructions furnished by the United States Surveyor-General for
