I N S T R U M E N T

The survey of this claim was made with a Keuffel and Esser Light Mountain Transit. The courses were deflected from the true Meridian as determined by an observation upon Polaris at elongation. The distances were measured with 500 ft. and 100 ft. steel tapes.

S U R F A C E

The surface embraced by this survey is low rolling hills, void of timber and other natural objects for bearings.

NOTE:- The difference between these field notes and the location certificate is due to errors in the latter; except that apparent discrepancy wherein the North Side Line, Survey No. 2765, Hidden Treasure Lode might be mistaken for western boundary, which is due to the fact that, prior to April 10, 1906, the date of amendment of location of Hidden Treasure Lode, there was no conflict, but Cor. No. 5, as well as Cors. No. 2, 3 and 4 was on northern side line of said Hidden Treasure Lode.

REPORT:- After dilligent search the S. 1/4 Cor. Sec. 34, Tp. 28-S., R. 63-E., M.D.M. could not be found.

The Government Section Corner, reported in this survey as the N.E. Cor. Sec. 3, is a rock 12 x 18 x 10 ins. set in a mound of stone, marked with 2 notches on the East, 4 notches on the West and 6 notches on the South edges.
