This survey was made with an A. Leitz
Mountain and Mining transit provided
with a Saegmuller solar attachment
the courses were deflected from the true
meridian as determined by solar
observation made with the solar attachment
The distances were measured with 100 ft
and 500 ft tapes

Report

The Section Corner of Sections 26-27-34 and
35 - I found to be a monument of rock
with a quartz rock S. 13. N. R. 24 E.
No. 10. B. and No. I found to be a quartz rock
14 ins. long 8 ins wide and 6 ins thick in
the center of a monument of stone
There were no marks upon the quartz rock
but as it is very brittle they have probably
become obliterated, and for the same
reason the stone has probably become
reduced in size
When I made Survey No 2914, I ran
from the corner to Secs 27-28-33 and 34
