I found no corner posts of any unsurveyed conflicting claims within the boundaries of claims embraced in this survey.

Note:- The section corners to which connection is given in these field notes is a quartz stone buried in the ground 18 ins. with a wooden post driven into the ground alongside of it, and checks with the tie line to survey No. 38, Navajo Lode, and with tie to Survey No. 1840, Leopard Lode, as recorded in the records of the U. S. surveyor general's Office for Nevada.

This survey was tied to the N. E. Cor. Sec. 3 T 39 N. R. 51 E. because it was the nearest corner of the public survey that could be indentified.
