Instrument

This survey was made with a C. L. Berger's and Sons No. 2 transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations.

The distances were measured with a 100 and 500 ft. steel tape.

Note.

The disagreement between these notes and the amended location certificate in regard to the courses and distances of the boundary lines and ties are due to errors in the latter.

Report.

All lines of this claim and the connection to the corner of the public survey were run upon the ground.

The N.W. Cor. Sec. 29, T. 21 N. R. 23 E. M. D. B. & M. is an andesite rock measuring 8 x 12 ins. by 12 ins. above a mound of stone with 5 notches on East face and 2 notches on the South face
