Improvement No. 3 is run for the development of
 the Contact and Jockey Lode. One half interest is accre-
 dited to each.

Improvement No 4 is run for the development of the
 Contact, Contact No I and White Horse Fraction Lodes
 and one third interest is accredited to each. The
 ground rises rapidly from the location monument of
 the Contact to the West and it is the intention of the
 claimants to drift along the vein in a westerly direction
 thereby cutting the veins of the contact No I and White
 Horse Fraction lodes.

INSTRUMENT

The survey was made with a Gurley light mountain
 Transit. The courses were deflected from the true merid-
 ian as determined by direct solar observations. The
 distances were measured with 100 ft. and 500 ft. steel
 tapes.

REPORT:

The S. W. Cor. Sec. 31, T. II N., R. 37 E. is a
 trap stone 12 x 10 x 5 ins. above ground marked S. C.
 with 6 notches on E. N. and W. edges.

Cors. No. 1 and 2 White Horse No 1 Lode (Unsd) eyed
 are pine posts 4 ins. square, showing 2 ft. above ground
 ground.
