The cor. of secs. 22, 23, 26, and 27, T. 1 N., R. 67 E., Mt. Diablo B. and M., is a pine post 4 ins. square extending 3 ft. above mound of stone, firmly set, marked S 23 T 1 N on N.E.; S 26 R 67 E on S.E.; S 27 on SW.; S 22 on N.W. faces; alongside of which I found a small stake, marks nearly obliterated, which is supposed to be the original corner.

Cor. No. 4, Survey No. 3096, Scranton Mine lode, is a 4 x 6 ins. post, firmly set, extending 2 ft. above mound of stone, scribed on north face 4-3096.

Cor. No. 2, Survey No. 2526 Daly East lode is a 4 x 6 in. sawed pine post, firmly set, extending 2 ft. above mound of stone, and scribed 2-2526.

The N.E. and S.E. corners of Silver Peak lode, (unsurveyed) are 4 x 4 ins. sawed pine posts, extending 3 ft. above mound of earth and stone, and marked N.E. Cor. Silver Peak and S.E. Silver Peak, respectively.

The N.W., S.W., and N.E. corners of April Fool lode (unsurveyed) are 4 x 4 ins. sawed pine posts, set in mound of earth and stone, and marked N.W. Cor. April Fool, S.W. Cor. April Fool, and N.E. Cor. April Fool, respectively.

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The N.E., S.W., N. side center and S. side center Telephone lode, (unsurveyed) are 4 x 4 ins. posts well set, extending 2 ft. above mound of earth and stone and
