LOCATION.

This claim is located in the S.1/2 of Sec.25 and the N.1/2 Sec.36 T.24 N.R.62 E. Mount Diablo Base, and Meridian.

EXPENDITURE OF FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS.

I certify that the value of labor and improvements upon this claim, placed thereon by the claimants and their grantors, is not less than Five Hundred Dollars and that said improvements consist of:

- No.1. The discovery shaft the center of which bears from Cor.No.1 N.19°17'E. 540.0 ft.
4 × 6 × 10 ft. deep in rock. Value \$60.00
- No.2. A shaft the center of which bears from Cor.No.1 N.11°40'E. 250.0 ft.
6 × 6 × 8 ft. deep. Value \$50.00
- No.3. A shaft the center of which bears from Cor.No.1 N.0°44'W. 189.4 ft.
4 × 6 × 50 ft. deep. in rock. Value \$500.00
- No.4. An incline shaft the center of which bears from Cor.No.1 N.0°14'E. 161.7 ft. 4 × 6 × 90 ft. deep, with drift at bottom 4 × 6 × 20 ft. long. Course of drift north. Dip of shaft 50° to N.W. Value of shaft and drift = \$1100.00
- No.5. A shaft the center of which bears from Cor.No.1 N.26°03'E. 127.7 ft.
4 × 6 × 6 ft. deep in rock. Value \$20.00
- No.6. A tunnel the portal of which bears from Cor.No.1 N.32°43'E. 65.7 ft.
4 × 6 × 33 ft. long in rock. Course N.20°25'E. Value \$300.00

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a C.L. Berger & Sons Transit No. 5406. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with a 6 ft. and 500 ft. steel tapes.

REPORT.

- 1st. The lines of this survey and the connections to the corner of the Public Land Survey were run upon the ground.
- 2nd. Lot No. 39 Pacific lode. All corners of this survey are missing. The Pacific tunnel was positively identified by claimants herein and the ties given from Cor.No.1 Flagstaff lode to the portal of this tunnel.
- Lot No. 41 A Sarah lode. All corners of this survey are missing and its position could not be determined upon the ground.
- 3rd. The S.1/4 Cor. Sec. 25 T. 24 N. R. 62 E. Mount Diablo Base and Meridian is a cedar stake 2 ins. square, 3 ft. above ground in a mound of earth, scribed 1/4 S. on the North face.
