

A bunk house, the S. E. Cor. of which bears from Cor. No. 3 Rhoda lode N $36^{\circ}30'$ W 614 feet, 26 X 30 feet. Course of long side N 16° E.

An ore house, the N. W. Cor. of which bears from Cor. No. 1 Benjamin Harrison lode S $24^{\circ}30'$ E, 287 feet, 10 X 15 feet. Course of long side S 10° W.

A whim house, the S. E. Cor. of which bears from Cor. No. 3 Rhoda lode N $36^{\circ}30'$ W 580 feet, 26 X 30 feet. Course of long side N 16° E.

Said buildings belong to claimant herein.

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Lietz transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by solar observations. The distances were measured with 6 foot and 330 foot steel tapes.

REPORT.

The S. W. Cor. Sec. 20, T27 N. R. 48 E., M. D. B. and M. is a cedar post 3 X 3 inches, set in a mound of stone and marked with 5 notches on the east face and 2 notches on the south face.

The U. S. Mineral Monument No. 1 is a pine post 6 inches in diameter set in a mound of rock and earth and marked U. S. M. M. No. 1.

Cors. No. 1 and 2, Sur. No. 52, Maid Queen lode, are pine posts, squared at the top and scribed 1-52 and 2-52 respectively. The course of line 1-2, Sur. No. 52, Maid Queen lode is S. $11^{\circ}45'$ W, instead of S 6° E as given in the approved field notes thereof.

Cor. No. 3, Sur. No. 47, Ventura lode, is a pine post, squared at the top, but with no legible markings. No other corners of this survey are standing. The courses and distances of lines 2-3 and 3-4, Sur. No. 47, Ventura lode, as given in the approved field notes thereof were used.

I made diligent search for corners of the public land survey, nearer than the S. W. Cor. of Sec. 20, T. 27 N. R. 48 E., M. D. B. and M., but found none.
