Shaft bears from Cor.No. 4, S.41°E. 596 ft. 4x8x115 ft. deep timbered, from bottom of shaft a drift 4x6 ft. runs S.77°43'W. 102 ft. thence N.79°W. 50 ft. thence N.50°W. 48 ft. to breast all in rock .

Value of Shaft and Drift \$ 5,450.00

Mouth bears from Cor.No.2, S.49°30'E. 855 ft. running N.70°E. 17 ft. 4 ft. wide, 8 ft. face in rock, claimant unknown .

 INSTRUMENT. ✓

This survey was made with a Gurley Light Mountain Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by solar observations. The distances were measured with 50 ft. and 500 ft. steel tapes.

 REPORT.

The 1/4 Corner between sections 12 and 13, T.12 S. R.45 E. Mount Diablo Base and Meridian is a rhyolite stone showing 8x6x8 ins. above the ground chiseled 1/4 on the north side ; Whence mound of stone 2 ft. high and 2 ft. base bears north 2 ft.

U.S.L.M. No.170, is a pine post, 6 ins. square, set on the summit of Bullfrog Mountain , showing 36 ins. above mound of stone 3 ft. high, 5 ft. base scribed U.S.L.M. No.170, on S.E. side.
