A frame building, the S.W. Cor. of which bears from center of line I-2, Big Four lode, S.63°E., 118 Ft., 16½x 24 ft., course of long sides, S.77°30'E.

Said buildings belong to claimant herein.

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INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Gurley Solar Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with 50-ft. and 500-ft. steel tapes.

Note:- The disagreements between these field notes and the location certificates of the Big Four and Never Sweat lodes, with regard to the position of the discovery point and location cut of the Never Sweat lode, and the courses of the boundary lines, are due to errors in the latter.

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REPORT.

The N.W. Cor. of Sec. 13, T.31 N., R.63 E., is a pine post, 4 ins. square, set in a mound of stone and extending 1½ ft. above it, scribed T.31 N., S.12 on N.E., R.63 E S.13 on S.E., S.14 on S.W. and S.11 on N.W. faces.

The N.W. Cor. of the Snowbank lode, unsurveyed, is a pine post, 4 ins. square, set in the ground, in a mound of earth, and extending 2 ft. above it, marked North West Corner Snowbank Lode.

I ran East from the north-west corner of Sec. 13, and attempted to find the ¼ Sec. Cor. on the north boundary of the Section, but after diligent search, was unable to find any trace of it.
