Report.

All lines of this survey, the tie lines to the S. $\frac{1}{4}$ Cor. Sec. 29, and to the corners of all adjacent and conflicting lodes were run direct upon the ground, or calculated from traverses, all lines of which were run direct upon the ground. The courses and lengths of all lines of conflicting lodes were determined by actual survey.

The S. $\frac{1}{4}$ Cor. Sec. 29, T. 21 N., R. 23 E., M. D. B. and M. to which connection is given is a porphyry stone 8x10 ins. 1 ft. above ground, in mound of stones, chiseled $\frac{1}{4}$ on the east side.

The S. W. Cor. Sec. 20, T. 21 N., R. 23 E., M. D. Band M. altho' nearer to this claim than the S. $\frac{1}{4}$ Cor. Sec. 29, was not in place. Its location was determined by running the tie line of Sur. No. 2591, Mattie B. lode, S. $80^{\circ}11'$ W. 2785.2 ft from Cor. No. 1.

At this point a pine post 3 ins. dia. $2\frac{1}{2}$ ft above ground was found. No other evidence of a corner was to be had.

Cor. No. 2 Sur. No 25-75 Nolon lode is a sawed pine post 4x4 ins. 3 ft. above ground in mound of stones, scribed 2-25-75- Nolon.

The N. E. and N. W. corners Big Twenty lode, unsurveyed, are posts 5x5 ins., $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft. above ground and scribed N. E. Cor.
