✓ No. 3 A tunnel 4 ft. wide x 6 ft. high, the mouth of which bears from Cor. No. 2 Norwich lode S., $67^{\circ}48'$ E., 192 ft. Tunnel runs S., 34° E., 360 ft. in solid rock. Value, \$6500.00 This tunnel is under construction for the development of this claim, and by drifting will be practical for the development work of the Hit or Miss No. 1 and Hit or Miss No. 2 lodes. An undivided $\frac{1}{3}$ interest in this improvement is credited to each lode location of this claim. ^{other} The improvements are credited to their respective locations.

✓ No. 4 The discovery cut of the Hit or Miss No. 1 lode, the mouth of which bears from Cor. No. 3 N., $2^{\circ}09'$ E., 753 ft. 12 ft. wide x 4 ft. face, running N., 70° E., 10 ft. to face in earth and rock. Value, \$100.00

✓ No. 5 The discovery cut of the Hit or Miss No. 2 lode, the mouth of which bears from Cor. No. 1 S., $29^{\circ}21'$ E., 736 ft. 7 ft. wide x 6 ft. face, running S., 80° E., 14 ft. to face in earth and rock. Value, \$100.00

✓ REPORT.

U.S.L.M. No. 202 is a pine post 6 ins. x 8 ins. x 8 ft. long set 3 ft. in solid rock, with rock mound 6 ft. in diameter 3 ft. high, a $\frac{3}{4}$ inch x $4\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long galvanized pipe inserted in center of top; post is scribed U.S.L.M. No. 202.

Section Cor. common to Secs. 21, 22, 27 and 28, T. 12 S., R. 47 E., M.D.M., is a rock 8 ins. square, 10 ins. above ground, marked 11 S. side, and 111 on E. side.

$\frac{1}{4}$ Cor. common to Secs. 21 and 22 is a sharp stone 12 ins. high inserted in crevice of ledge, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on E. side.

Sec. Cor. common to Secs. 27, 28, 33 and 34; Sec. Cor. common to Secs. 20, 21, 28 and 29, and Sec. Cor. common to Secs. 23, 25, 26 and 27 I was unable to find after careful tracing.

The intersections of the above section lines with the boundary lines of this claim are taken from the official notes of the Township survey.
