INSTRUMENT.

This Survey was made with a Young & Sons transit.
The Courses were deflected from a meridian established
by Polaris observation at Cor. No. 1.

The distances were measured with a 660 ft. Lufkin
steel tape.

REPORT.

The N. E. Cor. Sec. 24, T. 14 N., R. 37 E. M. D. B.
and M., is a porphyry stone, 4 x 9 x 12 ins. above a
mound of stone, marked with 3 notches on North edge
and 3 notches on South edge.

The tie to this corner was made after a diligent
but unsuccessful search for corners closer to the
claim.

Note.- Intersections with the sec. line were calculated
from the approved notes of the Public Land Survey.

All corners of this Survey have a cross (x) chisel-
ed to indicate the exact corner points.
