

Pirate lode, uns,

The S. E. and S. . Cors. are mounds of earth and stone 2 ft. high and 4 ft. bases, not marked, identified by survey. The East side center is a mound of stone 2 ft. high, 3 ft. base in which is a peg marked Pirate.

Scorpion lode Sur. No. 2051.

Cors. Nos. 1 and 2 are identical with Cors. Nos.

3-4 of the Fool lode of the same survey.

The  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. Cor. on east boundary Sec. 26, T. 3 N., R. 42 E. M. D. B. and M. is a porphyry stone 8 ins. long,  $5\frac{1}{2}$  ins. wide,  $4\frac{1}{2}$  ins. thick on a white porphyry stone set firmly in the ground 12 ins. above its surface 12 ins. wide, 6 in the ground, 12 ins. above its surface, 12 ins. wide 6 ins. thick, marked  $\frac{1}{4}$ .

I was unable to check with the following courses of Sur. No. 2051 Fool lode.

 S.  $40^{\circ}50'$ E. 284.0 ft.  
 6-1 S.  $82^{\circ}31'$ W. 600.0 ft.

The result of my retracement of the same lines are as follows, to wit:

 3-4 N.  $82^{\circ}21'$ E. 598.18 ft.  
 6-1 S.  $82^{\circ}21'$ W. 599.09 ft.  
 4 to  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. Cor. Bet. Secs. 25 and 26  
 S.  $40^{\circ}59'$ E. 283.20 ft.

In order to check the accuracy of my survey I run on the ground a connecting line bet. Cor. No. 5, Columbia lode of this survey, to Cor. No. 1 Sur. No. 2350 Aspen lode which is shown on the plat and field notes of this survey. The calculated traverses of the agreements and disagreements are herewith returned with the notes of this survey.
