

SURVEY No. 3388.

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a C. L. Berger and Son's Light Mountain Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with 5 ft. and 500 ft. steel tapes.

Note.

The disagreements between these field notes and the location certificates are due to errors in the latter.

REPORT.

The E. $\frac{1}{4}$ Cor. Sec. 1, T. 6 S. R. 40 E. M. D. B. and M. is a stone showing 4 x 8 x 16 inches above ground, chiseled $\frac{1}{4}$.

Cor. No. 3 Sur. No. 2793 Gold Coin lode is a rock in place 20 x 20 x 2 inches above the general surface of the ground, chiseled X and 3-2793.

Cor. No. 4. Sur. No. 2793 Gold Coin lode is a stone 5 x 7 inches, standing 12 inches above ground, chiseled (x) and 4-2793.

Cor. No. 2 Sur. No. 3281 Lenore lode is a pine post 4 ins. square, standing $2\frac{1}{2}$ ft. above ground in mound of earth and stone, scribed 2-3281.

I find lines 2-3, 3-4 and 4-1 Sur. No. 2793 Gold Coin lode to be N. $86^{\circ} 54'$ W. 1493.4 ft., S. $1^{\circ} 57'$ W. 580.5 ft., and N. $88^{\circ} 02'$ E. 1492.4 ft. instead of N. 87° W. 1500 ft., S. $1^{\circ} 52'$ W. 579.8 ft. and S. $88^{\circ} 08'$ E. 1500 ft. as approved.
