#### INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Buff & Buff No. 2 Mining Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct observation on Polaris. The distances were measured with 100 ft., and 300 ft. steel tapes.

Note;-- The disagreements between these field notes and the amended certificate of location of this lode, with regard to the courses of the southern boundaries, are due to errors in the latter.

Report;-- The S. W. Cor. to Sec. 35, T. 28 S., R. 63 E., MT. Diablo B. & M., is a rock 12x12 ins., set in the center of a ring of rocks, and marked with two notches on the east, four notches on the west, and six notches on the south.

All lines of this survey, including the tie line to the S. W. Cor. of Sec. 35, T. 28 S., R. 63 E., Mt. Diablo B. & M., were made by separate and distinct traverses, all lines of which were run direct upon the ground.

The surface of this survey consists of flat mesa or tableland, sparsely covered with greasewood and a few scattering yucca palms, but is devoid of natural landmarks to which bearings could be taken from the several corners thereof.

The corners on the ground to which connection is given are described as follows;

Cors. Nos. 1, 2, and 3, Sur. No. 2656, Surprise Lode, are posts
