A stable, the Northwest Cor. of which bears from Cor. No. 7 of this survey, N.39°34' E., 967 feet dist., 16 feet by 48 feet. Course of long sides, South.

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a LIETZ Light Mountain Transit and the courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct Solar observations.

The distances were measured with a 500 ft. steel tape.

REPORT.

U. S. Location Monument No. 164 is a conglomerate rock in place, 4 feet by 2 1/2 feet by 2 feet above the ground, chiseled U. S. L. M. No. 164, with X at Corner point.

The corner to sections 34 and 35 on the South boundary of T.33 N., R.23 E., M.D.B. and M., is a granite rock, 18 by 12 by 8 ins. above the ground, properly marked, with a mound of earth North.

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
