

Survey No. 3433

A shaft the center of which bears from Cor. No. 2 Amarilla lode N. 6° 45' W. 340 ft. 4 x 6 x 10 ft. deep.

(claimants unknown)

A cut the mouth of which bears from Cor. No. 2 Amarilla lode S. 18° E. 240 ft. 4 x 15 ft. with 6 ft. face, course S. 17° E.

(claimants unknown)

A house 12 x 14 ft. the S.E. Cor. of which bears from Cor. No. 2 Sonoma lode N. 32° E. 750 ft. Long side North and South.

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a C.L. Berger & Sons Transit No. 5406. The courses were deflected from the true Meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with a 6 ft. and 500 ft. steel tape.

REPORT.

- 1st. The lines of this survey and the connections to U.S. Location Monument No. 215, also tie to Corner Sections 22-23-26 and 27 T. 28 N.R. 52 E. Mount Diablo Base and Meridian were run upon the ground.
- 2nd. U.S. Location Monument is a sawed pine post 6 x 10 ins. 8 ft. above ground, in a mound of stone 6 ft. base and 4 ft. high, scribed U.S.L.M. No. 215.
- 3rd. Corner Sections 22-23-26 and 27 T. 28 N.R. 52 E. Mount Diablo Base and Meridian is a cedar stake 1-1/2 ins. in diameter, squared at top, 2-1/2 ft. above ground and scribed XXVI-T-XXVIII-N-R.LII-E. XXVII-XXII-XXIII.
