The courses were deflected from the true meridian, as determined by direct solar observations

The distances were measured with 100 and 650 ft steel tapes.

Report.

The easterly half of the Mobile lode is covered by high cliffs and deep ravines that are impossible to chain over, and triangulation is impracticable.

Cors. No. 2 and No. 3. were found in place and well marked.

Witness Cors. No. 1. and No. 4. were the original side-line posts of the Mobile location. Cors. No. 1. and No. 4. were established in accordance with the location notice, it being impossible to find where the original location corners were placed.

Cor. No. 3. Sur. No. 2044 Copper Chief lode, is a 3×6 in. post, extending 3 ft. above a mound of stone, scribed 3-2044 C.C. 7. 1888. on the south east face.

The Cor. to Secs. 35 and 36. T. 24 S. R. 57 E. and to Secs. 1. and 2. T. 25 S. R. 57 E. is a 8×12 in. limestone rock, set in a mound of stone. Section Corner being marked with 2 notches on east face, and 4 notches on west face.
