

ft. from the Location Monument, instead of 600 ft., as called for in the Notice of Location, while the North end center, and corners, were 927.7 ft. from the Location Monument. The stone stable, called for in the Location Notice, has been torn down, but the ruins are still there, at the center. The Independence Hoisting works and Black smith shop have also been removed from the North end. The Independence shaft, which was at the East end of the Hoisting works, is N.2°E., 71 ft. from the center of line 3-4, and the old North center of the lode is at the West side of where the black smith shop stood.

The Location Monument of the Lode is a 2-in. iron pipe, extending 3 ft. above ground, and set in a mound of stone, with a 2 x 4 in. piece of wood fastened to the upper part, marked Location Point Eclipse Lode.

X The S.E. Cor. of Sec. 34, T.40 N., R.51 E., M.D.B. & M., is marked by an iron rod 1 1/2 ins. in diameter driven into the ground and extending 2 ft. above it, in mound of stone. This corner is within the limits of the town of Tuscarora, and the old corner post has been destroyed.

Cor. No. 3, Sur. No. 42<sup>and</sup>38, Navajo lode, is a post 4 ins. square, extending 3 ft. above ground, marked Cor. No. 1, U. S. S. 42<sup>and</sup>38.

Cor. No. 2, Sur. No. 1875, Eira lode, is a porphory stone 12 x 12 ins., extending 12 ins. above ground, chiseled 2-1875, with a cross (X) at exact corner point.

Cor. No. 3, Sur. No. 1875, Eira lode, is a porphory stone, 13 x 13 ins., extending 12 ins. above ground, chiseled 3-1875, with a cross (X) at exact corner point.

Cor. No. 3, Sur. No. 1875, Big Betsey lode, is a porphory stone, 11 x 12 ins., extending 12 ins. above ground, chiseled 3-1875, with a cross (X) at the exact corner point
