

SURVEY NO. 3535.

Instrument.

This survey was made with a C. L. Berger and Sons Light Mountain Transit. The courses were deflected from the true Meridian as determined by direct solar observations and checked by observations upon Polaris. The distances were measured with 100 ft. and 660 ft. steel tapes.

REPORT.

Note: The disagreements between these field notes and the location certificates with regard to courses of the boundary lines is due to error in the latter.

The corner to Secs. 1 and 12 on the East Boundary T. 7 S., R. 41 E. Mt. Diablo Base and Meridian is a stone 8 x 9 x 6 ins., above ground, chiseled with 1 notch on North and 5 notches on South sides.

Cor. No. 1, Sur. No. 3529 Mohawk Fraction lode is a 4 x 4 ins. pine post extending 1 ft. above a mound of earth, scribed 1-3529.

Note: Intersections with lines of the Public Land survey are figured through the official records of said survey.

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
