This survey was made with a
 Dietzgen transit. The courses
 were deflected from the true
 meridian as determined by
 solar observations. The distances
 were measured with 500. ft. steel
 tape.

Report.

The S. E. Cor. Sec. 24, T. 7 S.
 R. 41 E. M. D. B. and M. is a granite
 stone 6 x 14 x 14 ins. surrounded by a
 mound of stone, chiseled II on S.
 side and IIII on N. side.

The lines of this survey were
 determined directly on the ground.

No corners of the public survey were
 found nearer the locations than
 the S. E. Cor. Sec. 24, T. 7 S., R. 41 E. M. D. B.
 and M.

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
