Report; — The S. E. Cor. to Sec. 36, Tp. 28 S., R. 61 E., M.D.M., to which connection is given in lieu of the N. E. Cor. to Sec. 1, Tp. 29 S., R. 61 E., is a black gneiss rock, 9 ins. by 9 ins., 18 ins. above the ground, with mound of rock, and chiselled six notches each on east, west and north faces.

Neither the N. E. Cor. to Sec. 1, Tp. 29 S., R. 61 E., M.D.M., nor the North 1/4 Sec. Cor. to said section could be found after diligent search. The points for both of these corners fall in the bottom of a steep gulch, draining a large area, and any monuments established therein would undoubtedly be washed out by the severe storms and cloudbursts which are frequent in this vicinity.

All lines of the two locations comprised in this survey, and the respective ties to the S. E. Cor. to Sec. 36, Tp. 28 S., R. 61 E., M.D.M., were made by separate and distinct traverses, all lines of which were run direct upon the ground.
