

Survey No. 3584.

Report.

The description of Ushin. No. 1 is as follows: A Pine Post $8\frac{1}{2}$ ft long, 4×4 ins. Set in ground to a depth of 1 ft. Surrounded by a mound of Stones (Copper Ore) 4 ft high 6 ft in diameter at base, the post being $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft. above the mound of stones or a total of $7\frac{1}{2}$ ft above ground. This post was Erected at the time of Survey of U.S.M.S. 1993, the country at that period not having been subdivided into sections. The said Ushin. No. 1 now bears from the N. $\frac{1}{4}$ Cor. Sec 27 T. 25 N. R. 28 E. Mid Btm. $N 64^{\circ} 50' W.$ 813.12 ft.

The description of the N. $\frac{1}{4}$ Cor. Sec 28 T. 25 N. R. 28 E. Mid Btm is as follows:

A mound of Earth $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft high with a thin post 1 in by 1 in. Standing in center 2 ft above mound. No flag to denote $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec Cor. but pits apparently having been previously placed E and W. of mound.

The description of the N. $\frac{1}{4}$ Cor. Sec. 27 and the E $\frac{1}{4}$ Cor. Sec 28. T. 25 N R 28 E. is as follows: -

A mound of Earth $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft high with thin post 1 in by 1 in. Standing in center 2 ft above mound. No flag could be seen, but evidences of pits N and S. of mound.

All posts surrounding the loads embraced in this Survey are 5 ft long, 4 ins. Square set 1 ft in ground in mounds of Earth and Stone.
