

SURVEY No. 3602.

OTHER IMPROVEMENTS.

A cut 27 ft. long, 7 ft. deep at face, 7 ft. wide, course S. 8° W. from entrance which bears from Cor. No. 1 S. 19° 52' W. 813.7 ft.

A trench 15 ft. long, 6.5^{ft.}₄ wide, average 2 ft. deep, Course South from North end, which bears from Cor. No. 1 S. 25° 32' W. 817.4 ft.

A cut 11 ft. long, 6.2 ft. wide, 8.5 ft. deep at face, course S. 8° W. from entrance which bears from Cor. No. 1 S. 57° 49' W. 1066.9 ft.

A cut 11.5^{ft.}₄ long, 6 ft. wide, 5 ft. deep at face, course South from entrance, which bears from Cor. No. 1 S. 78° 08' W. 1424^{ft.}₄.

A pit 10.4 ft. long, 7.2^{ft.}₄ wide, 5 ft. deep, the center of which bears from Cor. No. 2 N. 69° 12' W. 1269 ft., course of long sides S. 50° W.

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with an A. Leitz Light Mountain and Mining Transit provided with a Saegmuller Solar attachment. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by observation on Polaris at Eastern elongation.

The distances were measured with 50 ft. and 500 ft. steel tapes.

REPORT.

I found the N.W. cor. of Sec. 4 T. 30 N., R. 24 E. M. D. B. and M. to be well marked and witnessed as in the field notes of Survey of West boundary of that section by a trap rock 10 x 9 x 24 ins in a small mound of rock.

I found certain posts within the boundaries of this claim marked as designated on the plat accompanying these notes, which indicate that locations of lode claims had been made
