No. 2. A tunnel 4 by 6 ft. runs N.65°W. 41.0 ft. to face. From the face of the tunnel a cross-cut 4 by 6 ft. runs N.80°W. 61.0 ft. to face. From a point in the tunnel 30 ft. from the portal, a stope and drift 10 by 15 ft. runs N.30°W. 30.0 ft. to face. Center of portal of tunnel bears S.49°59' W. 317.3 ft. from Cor. No. 3.

Instrument.

This survey was made with a Gurley Engineer's transit, the courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observation. The distances were measured with 25 ft. and 660 ft. steel tapes.

Report.

The S.W. Cor. of sec. 20, T. 27 N., R. 48 E., of the Mt. Diablo Base and Meridian to which connection is given in these notes, is a cedar post 3 by 3 ins. set in mound of stone and marked with five notches on the east face and two notches on the south face.

The S.E. Cor. and the East Side Center of the Hidden Treasure Lode (unsurveyed) consist of cotton-wood posts 4 ins. square, 3 ft. above ground in mound of earth and stone and marked " S.E. Cor. Hidden Treasure" and " East Side Center Hidden Treasure" respectively.

Cor. Nos. 3-4, Rhoda and Benjamin Harrison Lodes, Survey No. 3207, consists of a pine post 4 ins. square, 3 ft. above ground, firmly set in mound of earth and stone and scribed 3-4-3207.
