OTHER IMPROVEMENTS

There are no other improvements upon this claim.

INSTRUMENT.

The survey of this claim was made with a Berger & Son No. 4 transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observation. The distances were measured with 500 ft. and 100 ft. steel tape.

SURFACE.

The surface embraced by this survey is low rolling hills, void of timber, and other natural objects of bearing.

NOTE:-- The differences between these field notes and the location notice are due to errors in the latter.

REPORT:-- The government section corner reported in this survey as the S.E. Cor. Sec. 34 and S.W. Cor. Sec. 35, Tp. 28 S., R. 63 E., M.D.M. is a rock 12x10 in. set in mound of stone chiseled 2 notches on the east, 4 notches west and six notches on the north.

Cor. No. 3 Survey No. 3240 Asterbilt Lode and Cors. 4 and 1 Survey No. 2100 Emma Fraction Lode, and Cor. No. 3 Survey No. 1959 Copper King Lode are each marked by a pine post 4-1/2 ft. long 4 ins. square set 18 in. in mound of earth and stone and each properly scribed.
