565 ft. 20 × 10 ft., 7 ft. face, course S.45°E.

No. 5 A cut, the face of which bears from Cor. No. 4, N.74°30'E.
550 ft. 8 × 15 ft., 5 ft. face, course S.15°W.

It is the intention of the claimant to develop the claims of this group by drifting from Tunnel No. 2, which tunnel is being driven to cross-cut the different veins, and one seventh of the value of this tunnel is credited to the Gibraltar lode.

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a C. L. Berger and Sons mining transit No. 6253. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with 6 ft. and 500 ft. steel tapes.

REPORT.

The Cor. Sec's. 2, 3, 10 and 11, T. 18 N., R. 64 E., Mount Diablo Base and Meridian, is a lime stone, 4 × 8 ins., 16 ins. long in a mound of stone, with 5 grooves on the south and 2 grooves on the east sides. This is the nearest standing corner of the public survey that can be found and identified.

The lines of this survey and the connection to the corner of the public land survey were run upon the ground.
