

FINAL OATHS FOR SURVEYS

5 Survey No. 3747.

The mountain towards the northeast from said improvements No. 2 and No. 3 rises steeply; towards the southwest the descent is gradual and the slope light. The mineralization is especially heavy in the region of said workings and the system of developement followed was one best calculated to open up a producing mine. Shipments of ore have already been made from said workings.

The house described as Improvement No. 6, was erected by claimant who is by trade a skilled stone mason, to be used for installing machinery to operate this group of claims. The value of said Improvements No. 2, No. 3, and No. 6, \$1625.00 is credited equally to the April and Silver Star Lodes.

OTHER IMPROVEMENTS.

The first 28 ft. of the drift described under the head of Improvement No. 2.

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a C. L. Berger and Sons Mining Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observation. The distances were measured with a 650 ft. steel tape.

REPORT.

THE S.W. Cor. Sec. 32, T. 1, N. R. 66 E., Mt. D. B. & M. is a limestone rock standing 1 ft. above the ground and surrounded by a mound of smaller stones. It is chiselled 5 notches on the east face, 1 notch on the west face, and S.C. on the north face.

This is the nearest known corner of the public survey that can be found.
