

REPORT.

The lode line of each location of this claim was run directly upon the ground and the several courses established by direct lines run upon the ground.

The Southeast Corner Sec.11, T33,N.R.36 E.,M.D.B.& M. is a conical shaped rhyolite stone, in place, standing 2 ft. above ground chiselled with one notch on the East corner and four notches on the South Corner.

The Southwest corner Sec.11 T 33N,R.36 E,M.D.B.& M. is a blue limestone rock loose in a pile, chiselled with two notches on the East face and four notches on the South corner.

The Southwest Cor.Sec.10,T 33N.,R.36 E.,M.D.B.& M. is a porphyry boulder, standing on end in pile, chiselled with three notches on the East corner and four notches on the South corner.

Survey No.37, Danish Council or Auld Lang Syne lode Cor.No.2. is a pine post properly set and scribed, which post, as well as all other posts of said survey have been reset, as the claim was resurveyed in the Fall of 1908, the original posts having all been destroyed, necessitating a new survey to identify the claim.

I find the South boundary of Sec.11.T.33N.R 36E.,M.D.B&M. to be as follows; Beginning at the S.W.Cor. of said section,thence S.89° 49' E.2655 ft. to S.¼ Cor. of said section, thence N.89° 07'E.2802.6 ft. to the S.E.Cor of said section.

I find the South boundary of Section 10, T 33N.R.36E., M.D.B.& M. to be as follows: Beginning at the S.W.Cor. of said section, thence S.89°08' E.,2690.5 ft. to the S.¼ Cor. of said section, thence N.89° 07' E. 2624.6 ft. to the S.E.Cor. of said section.

The E.¼ Cor. Sec.11, is a porphyry boulder 2 ft. high, 12 X 7 inches square, chiselled ¼ on E.side.

The S.¼ Cor. Sec.11 is a porphyry boulder 2 ft. long, 15 inches X 6 inches square, chiselled ¼ on S.side.
