discovery of the Idanha No. 6 lode; this ledge has its strike as near as can be determined N 45°W and would be intercepted by a cross-cut from the shaft of about 300 ft. in length. It is also the design of the owner to run a cross-cut from the shaft in a southwesterly direction to develop the ledge that has been exposed by the discovery cut of the Idanha No. 4 lode. Due to the conditions existing on this property it is readily seen that the money expended at least upon the excavation and the shaft should be apportioned equally to all the lodes of this claim.

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a C.L. Berger mining transit No. 3246. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by an observation on Polaris at eastern elongation. The distances were measured with a 100-ft. and 660-ft. steel tapes.

REPORT.

The S.W. Cor. Sec. 2, T. 23 N, R. 43 E, M.D.B. & M. is a quartzite stone 22 X 10 X 6 ins. set 10 ins. in ground with mound of stone around it, marked with 2 notches on the east and 5 notches on the south. The S 1/4 Cor. Sec. 2 bears S 89° 57' E 2616. ft. from the S.W. Cor. The W 1/4 Cor. and N.W. Cor. of Sec. 2, T. 23 N, R. 43 E, M.D.B. & M. could not be found.
