Instrument

The survey of this claim was made with a Buff and Berger transit.

Courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations

All distances were measured with 500 and 100 ft. steel tapes.

Report

The lode line of this claim was run upon the ground and the corners established by means of offsets from it.

The connection to the corner of the public survey and corners of conflicting claims were run upon the ground.

The S.E. Cor. Sec. 7, T. 16 N. R. 63 E. M. D. B. and M. is a limestone showing 8 by 8 by 10 ins. above the ground, with 5 marks on East and 4 marks on South face.

Cor. Nos. 1-2 and 3, Sur. No. 54 Union lode are posts 4 ins. square, 3 ft. above ground properly marked.

All corners of Sur. No. 3126 Shale Fraction, Olathe, Accident and Cloud lodes are posts 4 ins. square., 3 ft. above ground, properly marked

Cor. Nos. 2 and 3, Sur. No. 3357 Magnuson lode, are posts 6 ins. square., showing 2½ ft. above ground, properly marked.

Cor. Nos. 1 and 4, Sur. No. 3546, Great Western lode, are posts 4 ins. square, showing 3 ft. above ground, properly marked.
