N 75° 20' W 10 ft. to face, and the other

No. 4 An open cut and tunnel. The mouth
of open cut bears N 57° 05' E 570 ft.
from cor No. 1, and runs thence N 24°
30' E 21 ft. to 10 ft. face thence tunnel
continues on same course 62 ft. to face.

Value \$175.⁰⁰

Other Improvements.

No other improvements upon this claim
Instrument.

This survey was made with a
Buff and Buff light mountain
transit. The courses were deflected
from the true meridian as determined
by direct solar observations. The
distances were measured with a
100 and 650 ft steel tapes.

The difference between these field
notes and the location certificate
as to the position of the discovery
is due to an error in the latter.

Report.

The W. 4 Cor. of sec 19, T22 S. R.
58 E. 1st diablo B and M is a 2x2
inch. Cedar stake 2.5 ft. high in a
mound of earth and stone scribed 1/4 S
on west face, and referenced with bearing
trees. This is the nearest standing corner
of the public survey.

All location corners of this claim
are rock monuments 2 ft in diameter
and 3 ft high. Containing a paper on
which the corner is written.
