

No. 1. The discovery cut of the Denver Boy lode, the face of which bears from a point on line 1-2, Denver Boy lode, 219 ft. from Cor. No. 2, S.37°44'E. 291.2 ft., 4 ft. wide, 10 ft. face, running N.55°W. 12 ft. to mouth. In gravel and rock.

Value, \$50.00

The discovery and main working shaft of the Clara Belle lode is a common improvement made for the benefit of all the lodes embraced in this claim. The bottom of said shaft is considerably lower than any portion of the surface of said claim, and the entire claim can be easily and economically developed through said shaft, with one plant of machinery and one set of workings. This is especially true as the veins comprised within the limits of said claim all have a southerly dip, and will all be cut in depth by simply continuing said shaft. An undivided one third of said improvement (No. 1, Clara Belle lode) is, therefore, credited to each location embraced in this survey. All other improvements are credited to the respective locations upon which they are situated.

OTHER IMPROVEMENTS.

A corrugated iron shaft house, the N.W. Cor. of which bears from the discovery monument, Clara Belle lode, S.40°05'E. 287.5 ft., 14x20 ft., course of long sides S.64°E. Contains a Fairbanks-Morse upright gasoline hoisting engine.

A 26 ft. gallows frame at collar of main shaft, on the Clara Belle lode.

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a C. L. Berger mining transit, No. 4270. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by observation on Polaris at Western elongation. The distances were measured with 100-ft. and 500-ft. steel tapes.

REPORT.

The lode line of each location of this claim was run directly upon the ground, and the several corners established by means of offsets from the lode lines. All tie lines were run either directly upon the ground or by traverses, run upon the ground and submitted in a separate report herewith.
