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I N S T R U M E N T.

This survey was made with a C. L. Berger & Son's transit, No. 4548. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by observation on Polaris, and distances were measured with 100 ft. and 300 ft. steel tapes.

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R E P O R T.

The lode line of each location of this claim was run directly upon the ground. All tie lines were run either directly upon the ground, or by traverses run upon the ground and submitted in a separate report herewith.

The N.E. Cor. Sec. 5, T. 11 S., R. 46 E., M.D.M. is a porphyry stone, 4x10 ins., showing 10 ins. above ground, chiseled with 4 notches on the East side and 2 notches on the West side.
