

SURVEY NO. 3805 A and B. Continued.

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I N S T R U M E N T.

This survey was made with a C.L. Berger & Sons transit No. 4548. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by observation on Polaris. The distances were measured with 100 ft. and 300 ft. steel tapes.

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R E P O R T.

The lode line of each location of this claim was run directly upon the ground. All the lines were run either directly upon the ground, or by traverses run upon the ground and submitted in a separate report herewith.

The N.E. Cor. of Sec. 5, T. 11 S., R. 46 E., M.D.M. is a porphyry stone, 4x10 ins. showing 10 ins. above ground, chiseled with 4 grooves on the East side; two grooves on the West side.

Owing to the similarity of distances of the nearest corner of claims to the corner of the Public land survey, the S.E. Corner of every lode claim is made Corner No. 1. This will enable the boundaries of the claims to be easily traced from the field notes.
