

REPORT.

The lode line of this claim was run directly upon the ground, and the several corners established by means of offsets from the lode line. All tie lines were run directly upon the ground or by traverses, run upon the ground and submitted in a separate report herewith.

The N. E. Cor. Sec. 14, T. 26 S., R. 64 E., M.D.M., is a monzonite rock, 7x8 ins., standing 10 ins. above the ground, chiseled with one notch on the East face and two notches on the North face. This is the nearest standing corner of the public survey that could be found and identified.

Sur. No. 2082, Old John lode;--

Cor. No. 3 is a redwood post, properly set and scribed with the number of the corner and survey.

Sur. No. 3823, Yellow Ned lode;--

Cor. No. 1 is a redwood post, properly set and scribed with the number of the corner and survey.

Sur. No. 3847, Yosemite lode;--

Cor. No. 4 is a redwood post, properly set and scribed with the number of the corner and survey.

NOTE;-- A preliminary survey was made upon this lode about a year ago, at which time it was possible to positively identify only the discovery monument and the general course of the lode line. The survey of this lode as given herein is identical with said preliminary survey, as staked upon the ground.

This claim is supposed to be surrounded by valid mineral locations, and particularly to be adjoined on the south by the Star Parallel lode, unsurveyed. There are numberless stone monuments in this vicinity, but nearly all of them are unmarked, and it was impossible to identify said adjoining claims, or to report ties to them.

INSTRUMENTS.

This survey was made with a C. L. Berger light transit, No. 1279. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by observation on Polaris at eastern elongation. The distances were measured with 100-ft. and 500-ft. steel tapes.
