

SURVEY No. 3869.

- No. 9 A frame house the N. W. Cor. of which bears from Cor. No. 1, Hy Spy No. 1 lode, S.13°31'E. 395 ft. 18 x 36 ft. Course of long sides East and West. Claimants unknown.
- No.10 A frame house the N. W. Cor. of which bears from Cor. No. 1, Hy Spy No.1 lode, S.5°10'E. 643 ft. 35 x 40 ft. Course of long sides East and West. Claimants unknown.

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a C. L. Berger & Sons mining transit No. 6253. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with a 500 ft. steel tape.

REPORT.

The lines of this survey and all tie lines were run upon the ground.

The S. W. Cor. of Sec. 22, T. 18 N., R 64 E., Mt. Diablo B. and M. is a limestone 4 x 10 x 14 ins. high, in a mound of stone, chiseled with three grooves on the east and two on the south faces. This is the nearest standing corner of the public land survey that can be found and identified.

The S. $\frac{1}{4}$ Cor. of Sec. 22, T. 18 N., R.64 E., Mt. Diablo B. and M. is a limestone 10 x 11 ins. at the base, 14 ins. high and tapering to 4ins. square at the top. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on the north face, whence

Bearing S.56°17'W. 224.5 ft. is a limestone of triangular cross section 6 x 6 x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. 11 ins. high, in a mound of stone. Marked with a cross on top and $\frac{1}{4}$ on the south face.

Lyon lode, unsurveyed.

Corners 1 and 4 are pine posts properly set and marked N. W. Cor. Lyon and S. W. Cor. Lyon respectively. Line 4-1 is N.15°41'E. 1508.9 ft.
