INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a C.L.Berger mining transit No.3246. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by an observation on Polaris at eastern elongation. The distances were measured with 100-ft. and 660-ft. steel tapes.

REPORT.

The S.E.Cor.Sec. 32, T.28 N., R.46 E., M.D.M. is a quartzite stone 6 X 8 ins. showing 14 ins. above the ground, chisled with four notches on the east face and 2 notches on the west face, surrounded by a mound of stone. This is the nearest corner of the public survey that could be found and identified.
