

-----Instrument.

This survey was made with a C. L. Berger No. 4, Mountain, Mining and Reconnaissance transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with 100 ft. and 500 ft. steel tapes.

Report.

The boundary lines of the several locations of this claim were run directly upon the ground. All tie lines were run directly upon the ground.

✓ The S. E. Cor. of Sec. 9 T. 16 N. R. 63 E. M.D.B. and M. is marked by a stake 2 inches in diameter, squared at top, set in a mound of stone, and marked XVI, X, IX and XV. Also with 3 notches on the East and 4 notches on the South corners.

✓ The N. E. Corner of the above section is marked by a stone 6 x 12 inches, showing 14 inches above ground in a mound of stone, chiseled IIIII on South and III on East faces.

Manila Lode, unsurveyed.

✓ All corners are pine posts properly set and marked with name of claim and corner.
