REPORT.

All of the boundary lines of this claim were run direct upon the ground, and the tie to the N.W. Corner of section 31. T. 2. S. R. 42 E. was made direct from Cor. No. 4 Evanston lode, and the tie to the N. 1-4 Cor. said sec. 31 was made direct from Cor. No. 1 Evanston lode, and all other ties to the sec. Cor. and the 1-4 Cor. were calculated through this as given in the accompanying traverses.

The tie to Cor. No. 1. Sur. No. 3427 Piker lode was made direct as given.

I calculate the course and distance between the N. 1-4 Cor. and the N.W. Cor. sec 31 to be N. 89° 52' E. 2563. ft. instead of N. 89° 54' E. 25608 ft. as given in the original returns.

The N.W. Cor. said sec. 31 is a porphyry stone 12 x 12 x 10 inches chiseled 1 on S. face 5 notches on the N. face and 6 notches on both east and west faces. It is set in a mound of rocks about 4 ft. base and 1 ft high.

From it I took bearings as follows:-

Water tank on Black Butte bears N. 78° 43' E.

Cactus peak bears N. 81° 5' E.

Top of Slide Mountain bears S. 74° W.

A high point of yellow bluff bears S. 16° 41' E.

The N. 1-4 Cor. said sec. 31 is a porphyry stone 10 x 8 x 8 inches, chiseled 1-4. set in a mound of rocks.

Cors. Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4 Sur. No. 3427 Piker lode are as described in original returns. I find the tie from Cor. No. 1 to the sec. Cor. to be N. 88° 21' W. 2943.6 ft. instead of N. 88° 19' W. 2942. ft. as given in the original returns.

I find the boundary lines of Sur. No. 3427 Piker to be, 1-2. to be N. 9° 17' W. , 2-3 to be N. 80° 43' E, 3-4 to be S. 9° 17' E. and 4-1 to be S. 80° 43' W. instead of N. 9° 15' W, N. 80° 45' E, S. 9° 15' E. and S. 80° 45' W. as given in the original returns.

Cor. No 4. Sur. No. 3428 Havana lode is a pine post set in a mound of earth and rocks, showing 4 x 4 inches, 2.5 ft above ground. scribed 4-3428.

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
