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No. 2 A shaft, the mouth of which bears N. 76° 45' W. 505.0 ft. from Cor. No. 1, size 4x6 ft., 25 ft. deep.

Value \$250.00

No. 1 Discovery shaft, Texas Lode, the mouth of which bears N. 42° 06' W. 280.0 ft. from Cor. No. 1, size 5x7 ft., 90 ft. to bottom.

Value \$1100.00.

All of these workings are on veins, or running to veins, and will develop the claims in an economical manner.

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INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a C.L. Berger Mining Transit No. 6. The courses were deflected from the true meridian, as determined by direct solar observation. The distances were measured with 660 ft. steel tape.

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REPORT.

The lines of each location were run directly upon the ground, and corners established accurately at the corner points. All tie lines were run either directly upon the ground, or by traverses, submitted in separate report herewith.

The Cor. to Secs. 17, 18, 19 and 20, T. 5 N., R. 28 E., M.D.M. is a quartz boulder 12x10x24 ins., with three notches on the south and five notches on the east edges. Set in a mound of stone.

The 1/4 Cor. between Secs. 18 and 19, T. 5 N., R. 28 E., M.D.M. is a sandstone 12x18x24 ins. marked 1/4 on the North face. Set in a mound of stone.
