INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with an A. Lietz Light Mountain and
Mining Transit. The courses were deflected from the true
meridian as determined by observation on Polaris. The
distances were measured with a 50 ft. and 500 ft. steel
tapes.

REPORT.

The N.W. Cor. of Sec. 4, T. 30 N., R. 24 E. M.D.B. and M.
is properly marked and witnessed as reported in the field
notes of survey of the West boundary of said section, by
a stone 9 x 24 ins. in a small mound of rocks.

I found no workings nor monuments of any kind upon this
claim except the workings placed thereon by the claimant
or his grantors.

Cor. No. 4, Sur. No. 3602, Selenite Placer, which is identical
with Cor. No. 5, Sur. No. 3951, Esperanza Placer, is
a pine post 4 ins. square, showing 2½ ft. above the ground
in mound of earth, scribed 4-3602 and 5-3951-Esp.

Cor. No. 3, Sur. No. 3602, Selenite Placer is marked by a
pine post 4 ins. square, showing 2 ft. above the ground
in a mound of earth and scribed, 3-3602.

There are no ledges or indications of mineral of any nature
except gypsum embraced within the boundaries of this
claim.
