

A lumber and ruberoid cabin, the S.W. Cor of which bears from a point on line I-4 at S.19° 57' W, 859.4ft, from Cor.No.I Coyote lode, N.20° 05' E. 95.5ft. 9½x35ft. course of long side N.10° 00' E., claimant unknown erected without permission.

A tent and ruberoid saloon, the N.W. Cor. of which bears from a point on line I-4 at S.19° 57' W. 859.4ft. from Cor.No.I Coyote lode, S.81° 20' E. 92ft. 20x30ft. course of long sides, N.86° 00' W., claimant unknown, erected without permission.

A tin and lumber saloon, the N.W. Cor. of which bears from a point on line I-4 at S.19° 57' W. 859.4ft. from Cor.No.I, Coyote lode, S.23° 00' E. 94ft., 18x24ft, course of long sides N.86° 00' W., claimant unknown erected without permission.

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with an A.Lietz Co. large transit No.1921. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations

The distances were measured with a 500 ft. steel tape.

REPORT.

All tie lines were run directly upon the ground.

The S.W. Cor. Sec. 27, T. 46N., R. 39E., of Mt. Diablo E. & M. is a lava rock, 8x9x18 ins. long, set in mound of stone 20 ins. above the ground, chiseled with three notches on the East face, and one on the South face, this is the nearest standing corner of the public survey.

ERRORS.

All discrepancies between this survey and the location notices are due to errors in the latter.
